Description

A charming Victorian oak table-top collectors' cabinet, fitted with three graduated drawers and retaining its brass pull handles. Compact in scale yet full of character, it was designed to sit on a desk, table, or chest, providing orderly storage for the small and treasured objects of a well-appointed 19th-century home.

The cabinet is made in warm-toned oak, its simple, well-proportioned form allowing the natural grain and mellow patina of the timber to take centre stage. Each drawer is fitted with a brass pull handle, giving a pleasing contrast to the oak and lending the piece its quiet utilitarian elegance. Whether originally used for correspondence, jewellery, specimens, sewing accessories, or other personal possessions, it remains as practical today as it was when first made.

The cabinet is accompanied by particularly appealing provenance: it was once the property of Lady Rachel Egerton. This association gives the piece an added personal and historical dimension, transforming an attractive Victorian furnishing into an object with a tangible connection to a distinguished former owner.

Beautifully suited to a desk, dressing table, library, or cabinet of curiosities, it offers useful storage without sacrificing decorative appeal. It would make a thoughtful addition to an interior of traditional, country-house, or eclectic character, and will appeal to collectors of Victorian furniture and objects with provenance.
