Description

A charming set of five cut-glass sherry glasses, dating from the 1930s. Elegantly proportioned and finely decorated, each glass has a traditional bowl form enhanced by crisp cut detailing, which catches and reflects the light beautifully.

Designed for serving sherry, port, or other aperitifs, the glasses bring a sense of understated glamour to the table. Their sparkling surfaces and neat scale make them equally suited to an intimate drinks service, a formal dining setting, or a well-curated bar display. The set has the appealing combination of practicality and decorative presence that makes period glassware so enjoyable to use today.

The 1930s saw a continued appreciation for finely cut glass, with clean, confident patterns offering a stylish counterpoint to the more ornate designs of earlier decades. These glasses reflect that taste perfectly: traditional in material and function, yet fresh and elegant in their restrained decorative treatment.

A lovely group for collectors of early 20th-century tableware, or for anyone wishing to add a little period charm to entertaining. Displayed in a cabinet or used for a celebratory toast, they offer a delightful connection to the rituals of the cocktail hour and dining table of the interwar years.
