

18th-Century Gemset Pearl Pendant, Circa 1770

Description

A fine and rare 18th-century yellow-gold closed-back pendant, dating to circa 1770, exquisitely set with rose-cut and old-cut diamonds, ruby, emerald, and sapphire. The jewel is further embellished with natural saltwater pearls and finished with an exceptional natural pear-shaped pearl drop.

The richly coloured gemstones are arranged in a delicate, balanced composition, their varied tones enlivened by the soft, candlelit sparkle of the early-cut diamonds. The closed-back settings are characteristic of the period, designed to enhance the brilliance and colour of the stones, while the warm yellow gold provides a luxurious and harmonious ground for the gemset design.

The pearl drop forms the focal point of the jewel. Its natural pear-shaped form and gentle lustre lend the pendant a sense of movement, elegance, and rarity. Combined with the smaller saltwater pearls, it gives the piece the refined, opulent character associated with high-quality Georgian jewellery.

A remarkable survival from the late 18th century, this pendant captures the romance and sophistication of the Georgian era. It would make an important addition to a collection of antique jewellery, natural pearls, or historic gem-set goldwork, while remaining a beautiful and highly wearable jewel in its own right.
