

Early Victorian 15ct Gold and Cushion-Cut Amethyst Brooch

Description

An impressive early Victorian amethyst brooch, centred on a very large cushion-cut amethyst and set within an elegantly engraved 15ct gold frame, dating to circa 1840. Generous in scale and richly coloured, the jewel has the confident presence and refined craftsmanship associated with the finest mid-19th-century British jewellery.

The beautifully faceted amethyst displays the deep, luminous purple for which this gemstone has long been admired. Its softly rounded cushion cut allows the colour to glow from within, while the substantial gold mount frames the stone with warmth and definition. Fine engraved decoration around the setting adds texture and delicacy, creating a pleasing contrast with the bold simplicity of the central amethyst.

Jewellery of this period was often designed to be seen and admired, and this brooch has all the visual impact expected of an important Victorian accessory. Its large, vibrant stone and elaborate engraved frame would have made it a striking addition to a shawl, bodice, collar, or ribbon, while its timeless form remains equally compelling when worn today.

Amethyst was especially popular throughout the 19th century, valued for its regal colour and associations with refinement and sentiment. Here, the exceptional size of the stone and the quality of its gold setting give the piece a particularly luxurious character.

A beautiful and highly wearable example of early Victorian jewellery, this brooch would be an outstanding addition to a collection of antique gemstone jewellery or a memorable statement piece for special occasions.
