Description

A fine early 20th-century graduated strand of cultured saltwater pearls, dating to circa 1910, with a platinum and diamond barrel clasp. The pearls are carefully matched and gently graduate in size toward the centre, creating a graceful and beautifully balanced line when worn.

Each pearl displays a soft cream body colour with delicate pink overtones and an appealing, even lustre. Their gentle iridescence gives the necklace warmth and depth, while the restrained graduation creates an elegant, timeless silhouette that sits beautifully at the neck.

The strand is completed by an elegant platinum barrel clasp set with diamonds. The cool white metal and restrained sparkle of the diamonds provide a refined contrast to the pearls' warm pink and cream hues, adding a discreet note of luxury without interrupting the fluidity of the design. Both practical and decorative, the clasp reflects the sophisticated jewellery of the Edwardian era.

Cultured pearls were an exciting innovation in the early 20th century, and a necklace of this quality captures the period's preference for lightness, delicacy, and understated glamour. It is a versatile jewel-equally effective with an evening gown, bridal attire, or a tailored daytime look-and a distinguished addition to any collection of antique and period jewellery.
