Invented by Frenchman Louis-Marc-Antoine Loysel, this innovative device utilised steam pressure to force water through coffee grounds, producing a strong, flavourful brew. Unlike traditional brewing methods, it significantly reduced brewing time while enhancing the extraction process.

Loysel's percolator gained widespread acclaim, influencing the development of modern coffee-making technologies. It became a cornerstone in coffee culture, admired for its efficiency, simplicity, and superior results.
