Description

A Richard Pargeter George III silver salver of heavy gauge on raised feet and a fine engraved family crest. London 1734.

Richard Pargeter was an 18th-century London silversmith. He began his apprenticeship with Andrew Archer in 1718, later transferring to James Wilkes in 1724, and gained his freedom in 1726. Pargeter entered his first mark as a largeworker in 1730, followed by subsequent marks in 1737 and 1739.

His craftsmanship is much sought after by collectors and includes items like a 1734 sterling silver salver featuring a Chippendale border and scroll feet. Pargeter passed away in 1768 at the age of 66.
