Chinese Canton export teapots were crafted primarily during the 18th and 19th centuries for Western markets, particularly Europe and America. These porcelain teapots were made in Guangzhou (Canton), a key port in the China Trade era. T

They often featured hand-painted decorations-such as landscapes, figures, and floral motifs-in vibrant famille rose or blue-and-white palettes. Highly prized for their beauty and craftsmanship, Canton teapots became symbols of wealth and global trade, blending Chinese artistry with Western tastes.
