During the Middle Ages, they became more elaborate, reflecting social status and craftsmanship. By the 18th and 19th centuries, door knockers were widely used across Europe, especially in England, with designs ranging from simple iron rings to ornate brass pieces.

Today, they remain both functional and decorative, preserving a connection to architectural tradition and historical identity.
