

Victorian Pearl & Diamond Stick Pin

Description

A refined mid-19th-century yellow gold stick pin, dating to circa 1850 and set with a luminous natural saltwater pearl and an old mine-cut diamond. Elegant in its restraint, the piece captures the quiet luxury and exceptional workmanship of Victorian jewellery.

The pearl has a soft, satiny lustre, beautifully complemented by the warm tone of the yellow gold. Its organic radiance is enhanced by the adjacent old mine-cut diamond, whose hand-cut facets produce a gentle, lively sparkle rather than the uniform brilliance of a modern cut stone. Together, the pearl and diamond create a timeless pairing: sophisticated, romantic, and subtly opulent.

Stick pins were an essential component of 19th-century dress, worn to secure a cravat or scarf and chosen as a discreet yet telling expression of personal taste. This example has the delicacy and versatility to be worn today as originally intended, or adapted into a pendant, brooch, or other bespoke jewel if desired.

A charming and wearable Victorian jewel, offering the enduring appeal of natural pearl, antique diamond cutting, and rich yellow gold. A lovely addition to a collection of period jewellery or a thoughtful gift for a lover of antique gems.
