

Edwardian Samson & Mordan Silver Hatching Chick Pincushion

Description

A delightful Edwardian novelty silver pincushion by the celebrated makers Samson & Mordan, modelled as a chick emerging from its egg. Combining charming naturalistic modelling with the wit and fine workmanship for which the firm is renowned, this miniature object is a particularly appealing example of early 20th-century novelty silver.

The little chick is shown hatching from a cracked eggshell, its characterful form transforming a simple domestic sewing accessory into a small piece of silver sculpture. The pincushion element would originally have held pins and needles close at hand, while the bright silver body and playful subject make it a wonderfully decorative object in its own right.

Samson & Mordan was among the foremost makers of novelty silver and small luxury goods in late 19th- and early 20th-century Britain. Their work is admired for its imaginative subjects, precise construction, and ability to bring humour and elegance to the most everyday of objects. Animal-form pincushions remain among the firm's most sought-after creations, especially when presented in such an engaging and unusual design.
