Commissioned by European nobility, they served as both decoration and insulation in castles and palaces.

Renowned for their vivid colours and fine detail, Flemish tapestries, such as those from the workshops of Pieter Coecke van Aelst, influenced textile art across Europe. Today, they remain treasured artifacts, displayed in museums and historic estates world wide.
